Then Professor of Psychological Medicine, Institute of Psychiatry and King's College Hospital Medical School (1989-1999); Professor of Psychiatry and Chairman, Division of Psychological Medicine and Psychiatry, Institute of Psychiatry (1998-2009);

Professional involvement

Chaired the UK Schizophrenia Commission 2011-12 which reported on the quality of care of people with psychosis. Awarded a Knighthood in 2011 for "services to medicine and psychiatry". Member of Council of Royal College of Psychiatrists, Chairman Academic Faculty of the Royal College of Psychiatrists, Medical Research Council Advisory College of Experts (2000-2009). Chairman Medical Research Council Co-op in Neurodevelopmental Basis of Psychosis (2000-2004). UK Committee on Safety of Medicines, Council of Imperial College, Wellcome Trust Topical Interest Group Panel, Advisory Board, Centre for Mental Health Services Development (1998-2000). President of the Association of European Psychiatrists. International standing

At different times, advisor to various governments/ Universities/Research Councils for Psychiatric Services and Research – including UK, Holland, Norway, Sweden, Kenya, Jamaica, South Africa, Singapore, Hong Kong.

Contribution to research

I am the most frequently cited psychosis researcher outside the USA. h-index >160. I was one of the first to suggest that schizophrenia was in part a neurodevelopmental disorder (1987). My colleagues and I have subsequently made significant contributions to the understanding of the aetiology of psychosis; that not only susceptibility genes but also a range of environmental factors increase risk. In the last 20 years my focus has been on the importance of social factors such as child abuse, urban living, migration, intrusive life events, and on the role of abuse of cannabis; and how these factors interplay with genetic vulnerability.
